To expand the definition of qualified persons for purposes of the Public Readiness and Emergency Preparedness Act to include health professional students.

Sec. 2. Qualified Persons

* * * * * * * * *

(B) a medical, nursing, pharmacy, pharmacy intern, midwife, paramedic, advanced or intermediate emergency medical technician, physician assistant, respiratory therapy, dental, podiatry, optometry, *dental hygiene, dental therapy* or veterinary student with—

(i) appropriate training in administering vaccines, as determined by the student's school or training program; and

(ii) supervision by an individual described in subparagraph (A); or
